Why Pray the Stations of the Cross? 8 Reasons from Pope Francis

The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

The Stations of the Cross can be rich, deep, and meaningful, but at the same time we can lose sight of their significance and how to relate them to our everyday lives.

- 1. They Allow Us to Place Our Trust in Him**
- 2. They Put Us into the Story**
- 3. They Remind Us That Jesus Suffers with Us**
- 4. They Compel Us to Action**
- 5. They Helps Us Make a Decision for or Against Christ**
- 6. They Reveal God's Response to Evil in the World**
- 7. They Give Us the Certainty of God's Love for Us**
- 8. They Guide Us from the Cross to the Resurrection**

The Stations take us through from Jesus' arrest, his journey to His death on the Cross and finally being laid in the tomb.
